Property Tax Transparency

The Ector County Appraisal District determines the market value of your property as of January 1 of each year. Market conditions and property ownership on that date establish whether the property is taxable, its taxable value, and who is responsible for paying the tax. The district also processes applications for exemptions, special appraisals, and other forms of tax relief. For more information about the local appraisal process, please contact the Ector County Appraisal District.

On May 3, 2025, voters approved the creation of the Ector County Emergency Services Districts 1 and 2. Under Texas Property Tax Code Section 26.12, taxing units created between January 1, and July 1 are authorized to levy taxes for that year. By entering the owner's name, property ID, or property address, you can view details on taxes that may be imposed on your property by local taxing units, contact information for those units, dates and locations of public hearings on their tax rates, dates and locations of meetings where tax rates may be adopted, and opportunities to provide feedback directly to the taxing unit.
